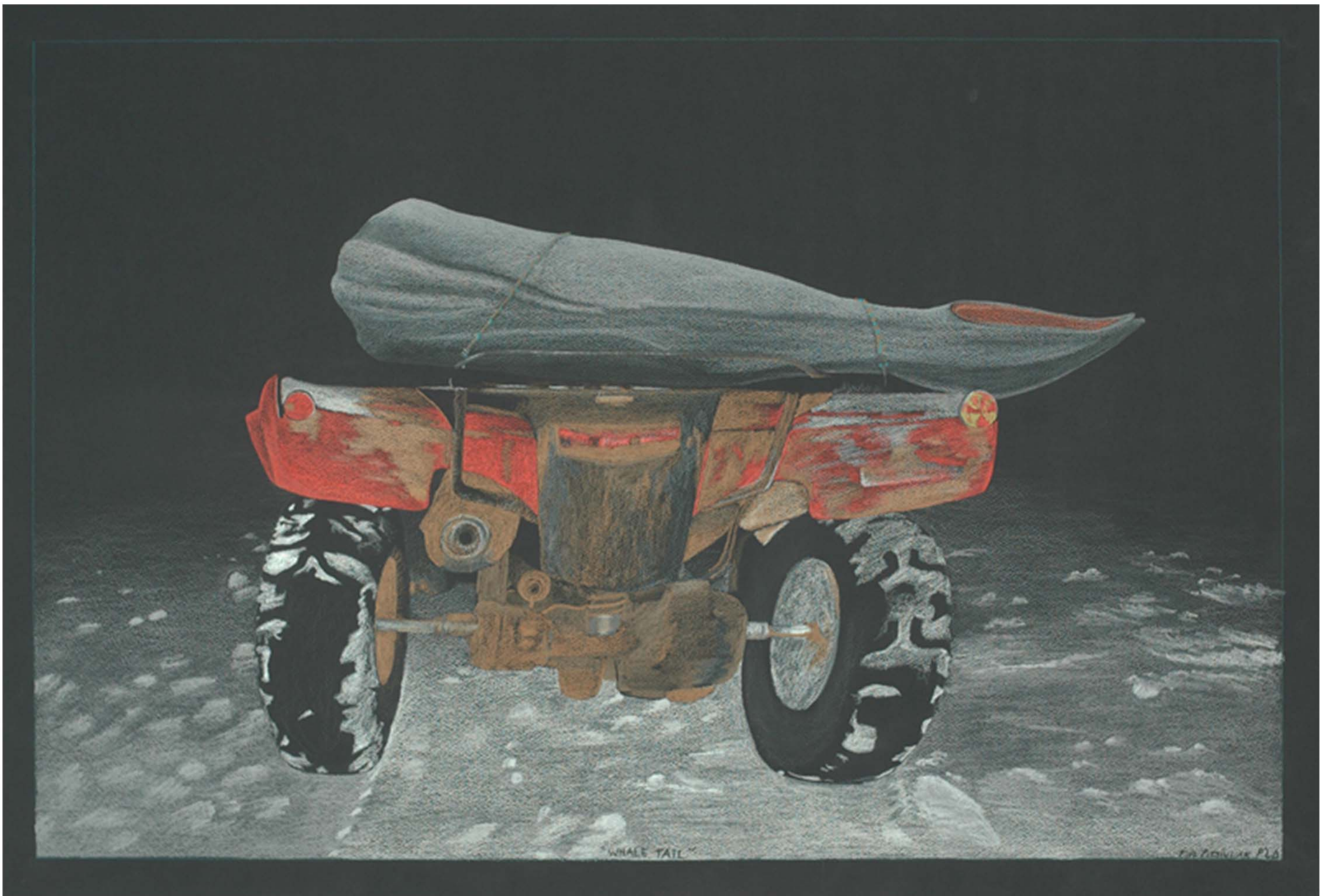

- Had his work featured on a Royal Canadian Mint commemorative 25-cent coin in 2013
